

Which Great Lake Is This?




- 1. This Great Lake is the shallowest and has an average depth of 62 ft (19 m).
- 2. It borders Michigan, Pennsylvania, Ohio, New York as well as the Canadian Province of Ontario.
- 3. The Northwestern side of this Great Lake (see arrow) travels up into this river and then into this heart shaped lake and then into another river before reaching Lake Huron. Can you name the 2 rivers and the heart shaped lake?
- 4. During the Toledo water crisis in the summer of 2014, over 400,000 people were issued a "do not drink" advisory because of the unsafe levels of the harmful algal toxin microcystin in treated drinking water drawn from this Great Lake.






Which Great Lake Is This?




- 1. It is the smallest of the Great Lakes in surface area, but it is over 800 ft at its deepest point.
- 2. This Great Lake serves as an outlet to the Atlantic Ocean via the Saint Lawrence River.
- 3. The Thousand Islands which number 1,864 are on this Great Lake.
- 4. It is the only Great Lake that does not border the State of Michigan.






Which Lake is This?

- This lake's shore is home to the largest freshwater sand dunes in the world

- 3. It is the only Great Lake that sits entirely in the U.S.
- This Great Lake is 307 miles long and 118.1 miles wide





Which Great Lake Is This?




- 1. This Great Lake is connected to Lake Michigan by the Straits of Mackinac.

- 4 It is 206.3 miles long and 183.3 miles wide.




Which Great Lake is This?




- Duluth Harbor sits at the tip of what looks like the nose of the wolf shape of this Great Lake. The largest freighter to come into Duluth Harbor was the Paul R. Tregurtha from The Interlake Steamship Co. It is 1013.5 feet from stem to stern.
- Forty miles north of Munising, MI is the deepest part of this Great Lake, 1,333 feet deep. How many meters is that? It is definitely the coldest and furthest north of the Great Lakes.
- 3. Isle Royale looks like the eye of this Great Lake. It is 45 miles long and has 166 miles of hiking trails! There are 200 islands on this island!
- 4. This lake is approximately 350 miles long and 161 miles wide.
